NJ COVID-19 Related Signed Legislation

- <u>\$2304</u> Concerns family leave and disability benefits during epidemic-related emergencies.
- A3865 Limits return of items purchased from retail food stores under certain circumstances.
- <u>A3861</u> Permits corporations to hold shareholders' meetings in part or solely by means of remote communication during state of emergency.
- <u>A3855</u> Requires food access information be displayed on websites of 2-1-1 system and executive branch departments during public health emergencies to the extent practicable.
- <u>A3854</u> Authorizes all licensed health care facilities and laboratories to collect specimens to test for coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19); allows waiver of staffing ratio requirements.
- <u>A3851</u> Permits extension of deadlines for adoption of county and municipal budgets under certain circumstances.
- <u>A3850</u> Allows public bodies to conduct meetings, and provide notice, by electronic means during periods of emergency.
- <u>A3849</u> Modifies deadline by which public agency is required to respond to request for government record during period of emergency.
- A3848 Concerns time off from work in connection with infectious disease.
- <u>A3845</u> Authorizes EDA to make grants during periods of emergency declared by Governor and for duration of economic disruptions due to emergency; allows EDA to grant certain business documentation submission deadline extensions.
- <u>A3843</u> Requires health insurance and Medicaid coverage for testing of coronavirus disease 2019 and for telemedicine and telehealth during coronavirus disease 2019 state of emergency.
- <u>A3840</u> Requires school districts to provide school meals or meal vouchers to students eligible for free and reduced price school meals during school closures due to COVID-19 epidemic.



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- <u>A3095</u> Provides county clerks with additional week to mail ballots for 2020 primary election; requires ballot position draw to occur one day early if statutory date falls on holiday.
- <u>A3862</u> Permits professional and occupational licensing boards to expedite licensure of certain individuals during state of emergency or public health emergency.
- <u>A3860</u> Establishes certain requirements to use telemedicine and telehealth to respond to coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).
- <u>A3852</u> Allows conduct of State business and legislative sessions at locations other than Trenton during periods of emergency or other exigency; allows conduct of legislative business using electronic means.
- <u>A3859</u> Concerns prohibition of residential tenant eviction and eviction due to residential foreclosure during certain emergency circumstances.
- <u>AJR158</u> Urges FCC to take temporary measures to secure broadband access for those affected by COVID-19.
- <u>A3901</u> Permits professional and occupational licensing boards to reactivate licensure of certain individuals during state of emergency or public health emergency.
- <u>A3903</u> Allows remote notarial acts during Public Health Emergency and State of Emergency declared by Governor in Executive Order 103 of 2020.
- <u>A3904</u> Permits use of virtual or remote instruction to meet minimum 180-day school year requirement under certain circumstances.
- <u>S2333</u> Provides civil and criminal immunity to certain health care professionals and health care facilities during public health emergency and state of emergency; facilitates issuance of certain temporary licenses and certifications during public health emergencies.
- <u>S2338</u> "COVID-19 Fiscal Mitigation Act"; clarifies filing and payment deadline for CBT and GIT taxpayers, modifies duration of State Fiscal Years 2020 and 2021, requires certain updates and presentation for State Fiscal Years 2020 and 2021.
- <u>S2342</u> Permits nonprofit corporations to allow members to participate in meetings by means of remote communication, and permits nonprofit corporations to hold meetings in part or solely by means of remote communication during state of emergency.
- <u>\$2349</u> Changes date of 2020 primary election from June 2 to July 7.
- <u>S2353</u> Excludes from severance requirements under "Millville Dallas Airmotive Plant Job Loss Notification Act" mass layoffs resulting from coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic.

Additional Programs for Businesses

- Small Business Emergency Assistance Grant Program A \$5 million program that will provide grants up to \$5,000 to small businesses in retail, arts, entertainment, recreation, accommodation, food service, and other services such as repair, maintenance, personal, and laundry services to stabilize their operations and reduce the need for layoffs or furloughs.
- Small Business Emergency Assistance Loan Program A \$10 million program that will provide working capital loans of up to \$100,000 to businesses with less than \$5 million in revenues. Loans made through the program will have 10-year terms with 0% interest for the first five years, then resetting to the EDA's prevailing floor rate (capped at 3%) for the remaining five years.
- Community Development Finance Institution (CDFI) Emergency Loan Loss Reserve Fund A \$10 million capital reserve fund to take first loss position on CDFI loans that provide low interest working capital to microbusinesses. This will allow CDFIs to withstand loan defaults due to the outbreak, which will allow them to provide more loans at lower interest rates to microbusinesses affected by the outbreak.
- CDFI Emergency Assistance Grant Program A \$1.25 million program that will provide grants of up to \$250,000 to CDFIs to scale operations or reduce interest rates for the duration of the outbreak.
- **NJ Entrepreneur Support Program** A \$5 million program that will encourage continued capital flows to innovation economy companies and temporarily support a cautious investor market by providing 80% loan guarantees for working capital loans to startup entrepreneurs.
- Small Business Emergency Assistance Guarantee Program A \$10 million program that will provide 50% guarantees on working capital loans and waive fees on loans made through institutions participating in the NJEDA's existing Premier Lender or CDFI programs.
- Emergency Technical Assistance Program A \$150,000 program that will support technical assistance to New Jersey-based companies applying for Economic Injury Disaster Loans through the U.S. Small Business Administration. The organizations contracted will be paid based on SBA application submissions supported by the technical assistance they provide.
